

ORDINANCE NO. 5

(Formerly Ordinance 98-04)

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE CITY

In order to protect property and property values, to provide safety for persons using the public streets of the City of Druid Hills, Kentucky, and to allow easy access for emergency vehicles, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRUID HILLS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful to park any motor vehicle, or any portion thereof on the paved portion of any public street of the City of Druid Hills between the hours of 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM of each day.

Section 2: It shall be unlawful (a) to park, either wholly or partially, a boat, camper, van, mobile home, trailer, truck or bus on a public street of the City, and (b) to park any vehicle identified in subsection (a) above on a private driveway or in a private front yard unless the entire vehicle is at least 21 feet from the edge of the paved street which abuts the property.

Section 3: Exempt from the provisions of Section 2 above are emergency vehicles, motor vehicles which are being used for loading or unloading, or motor vehicles which are parked on the street or driveway while the operator of the vehicle is transacting commercial business with the occupant of the residence on the lot.

Section 4: It shall be unlawful to maintain, establish, or install off-street parking on any residential lot in the City if such off-street parking fails to accommodate the full width of a private passenger car.

Section 5: It is the responsibility of the occupant of any residence in the City hosting a social function at which the guests exceed the property's available parking to assure that the guests park only on one side of the street while attending the event.

Section 6: A violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense.

Section 7: This Ordinance supercedes and combines portions of Ordinances formerly known as "Ordinance No. 1, Series 1978, Ordinance No. 2, Series 1978" and Ordinance No. 98-04, all of which are repealed by adoption of this new Ordinance.

Section 8: This Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption, approval, and publication as required by law.
